## SPANISH PART 2

### example of an -ar verb – “cantar”: to sing

yo canto nosotros cantamos  
tú cantas ustedes cantan  
usted canta                ellos cantan  
él canta                    ellas cantan  
ella canta

### example of an -er verb – “temer”: to fear

yo temo nosotros tememos  
tú temes ustedes temen  
usted teme                ellos temen  
él teme                    ellas temen  
ella teme

### example of an -ir verb – “vivir”: to live

yo vivo                    nosotros vivimos  
tú vives                  ustedes viven  
usted vive                ellos viven  
él vive                    ellas viven  
ella vive

### the irregular verb – “tener”: to have

yo tengo nosotros tenemos  
tú tienes ustedes tienen  
usted tiene                ellos tienen  
él tiene                    ellas tienen  
ella tiene

### the irregular verb – “querer”: to want

yo quiero                nosotros queremos  
tú quieres                ustedes quieren  
usted quiere              ellos quieren  
él quiere ellas quieren  
ella quiere

**days of the week:** (note: Spanish speakers consider Monday – not Sunday – the first day of the week)

Monday: lunes  
Tuesday: martes  
Wednesday: miércoles  
Thursday: jueves  
Friday: viernes  
Saturday: sábado  
Sunday: domingo

### months of the year:

January: enero  
February: febrero  
March: marzo  
April: abril  
May: mayo  
June: junio  
July: julio  
August: agosto  
September: septiembre  
October: octubre  
November: noviembre  
December: diciembre

### the seasons:

winter: el invierno  
spring: la primavera  
summer: el verano  
autumn: el otoño
